ARCHITECTURE

For an Arizona City, Wright Is Better Late Than Almost Never

Although Frank Lloyd Wright spent about half his time in Scottsdale, Ariz., the city has only one of his buildings — Taliesin, his winter residence and home to the Frank Lloyd Wright School of Architecture. A new project will remedy that shortcoming. The Promenade (above right) will provide a visitors' center, offices and restaurants while serving as an enticing entrance to the city. A 125-foot spire, designed by Wright for the Arizona State Capitol in the 1950's but never built, will be the most prominent feature. (The drawing, above, is his original sketch.) The spire, made of latticed copper painted a verdigris color, is being constructed off-site and will be erected late this year. It will feature poly-

carbonate glazing and will be lighted from within. The remaining structures, some based on Wright's designs for a drive-through bank that was never built, are scheduled to be completed by fall. Approval for the construction was a bit of a "community outreach project," said Arnold Roy, the Taliesin architect in charge of the project. Scottsdale has a height limit of 100 feet, and the tower exceeded that. The center, being built by the Pederson Group, will save the city from having another block of cookie-cutter retail stores (for which the area was originally zoned). In keeping with Wright's philosophy, the Promenade will include open space in which to celebrate the union of architecture and its environs.

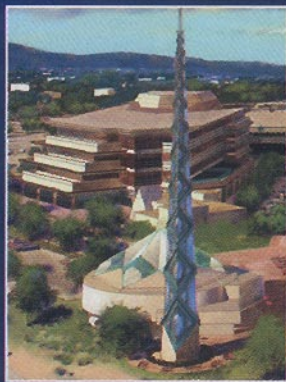
